



Raffles and Lotteries

All raffles and lotteries must abide by the Gambling Laws.

All monies raised from raffles or auctions must be given to the Charity, and cannot be used to cover expenses or losses incurred in organising an event.

Cloakroom ticket raffles

- Tickets must be sold at the venue during the event, and drawn before the end of the event.
- Tickets should not be sold outside the venue, or prior to the event.
- For tickets sold in strips, the counterfoils must be split and drawn individually and not drawn in strips.

To qualify under the 'exempt rule' there has to be an element of chance i.e. no guaranteed prize every time.

A successful raffle depends on the total money raised for the Charity, not the number of prizes given away. Up to 20 prizes is deemed as ample, guests at an event will generally buy raffle tickets whether there are 6 or 60 prizes on offer, and whether it's just a bottle of wine, or a trip abroad.

No cash prizes can be offered.

Registered Raffle (pre-printed books) – please speak to the Fundraising Office before proceeding

Lingen Davies Cancer Fund has a licence with the local authority for registered raffles.

If raffle tickets are to be sold before an event, tickets must be pre-printed according to the rules stipulated by the Charity's registration with the local authority, and with the Terms and Conditions specified by the Charity.

All tickets must be printed via the Fundraising Office. The Charity will cover the cost of printing.

No person, apart from nominated officers of the Charity, can be named as promoters of the Draw.

Specific wording needs to be included on the tickets, in accordance with regulations - please come and speak to us about this.

The prizes must be allocated as printed on the draw tickets, i.e. first prize goes to the first ticket drawn etc.

All sold & unsold tickets, details of prizes and the winners must be returned to the Fundraising Office together with draw information forms, following completion of the draw.

Any prizes left over or not used in a draw or an event, and that were obtained in the name of the Charity, should be passed on to the Fundraising Office. They must not be given away or used to fundraise for another Charity.
